
KIEDRICH KLOSTERBERG VDP.ERSTE LAGE® RIESLING SPÄTLESE



Weingut Robert Weil, founded 1875, is run today by Wilhelm Weil, the fourth generation of the founding family.

The founder of the estate, Dr. Robert Weil, purchased his first vineyards on the Kiedricher Berg in 1867, at a time when he was still a German professor at the Sorbonne in Paris. With the approach of the Franco-Prussian War of 1870/71, he was forced to leave France. He settled in Wiesbaden, where he worked as a journalist, and Kiedrich, where he expanded his vineyard holdings by acquiring the best sites on the Kiedricher Berg. Thanks to his unwavering commitment to quality-oriented viticulture, his foresight, and his willingness to invest in the estate, it developed quickly and its wines were soon celebrated in international circles. Spätlese and Auslese wines from Weingut Robert Weil graced the table of many European imperial and royal houses as the white counterparts of the Bordeaux reds.

Today, the estate's 90 ha (222 acres) of vineyards are planted 100% with Riesling.

Throughout its history the estate has always focused on the Riesling grape and adhered to strict, quality-oriented practices in the vineyard – such as stringent pruning to control yields and selective harvesting by hand – and in the cellar, where the wines are vinified as gently as possible. This unwavering and uncompromising quality management is central to Weingut Robert Weil's unbroken streak of producing wines at every Prädikat classification, up to and including Trockenbeerenauslese, for every vintage since 1989. The estate's dedication to Riesling since 1875 has led numerous observers of the international wine world to regard Weingut Robert Weil, with its "château character", as a worldwide symbol of German Riesling culture.


TASTING NOTES

A rich Spätlese, lush with ripe and nuanced fruit in the nose; the artful balance of natural sweetness and bright acidity provides a powerful structure, distinctive minerality, and a long, lingering finish.

VINEYARD NOTES

The Klosterberg borders the Kiedrich Turmberg and Kiedrich Gräfenberg - it is the third 'Berg' vineyard of Kiedrich. The name Klosterberg derives from the old path, the so-called 'Klosterweg', that crosses through the vineyards and links Kloster Eberbach to Kiedrich. The shallow to deep soil of the southwest facing cliffs are composed of Devonian (colored slate) and Pre-Devonian (phyllite and gneiss) rock interspersed with gravelly loess.

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

VINEYARD NOTES

The name of the hillside site Klosterberg (literally, monastery hill) derives from "Closterweg," the old path that ran through this vineyard in Kiedrich en route between the monastery Kloster Eberbach and its mill near Eltville. The shallow to deep stony-gritty soils of the southwest-facing site are of Devonian (coloured sandstone) and pre-Devonian (phyllite and serecite gneiss) origin, and are mixed with gravelly loess.

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

VINEYARD NOTES

The Klosterberg borders the Kiedrich Turmberg and Kiedrich Gräfenberg - it is the third 'Berg' vineyard of Kiedrich. The name Klosterberg derives from the old path, the so-called 'Klosterweg', that crosses through the vineyards and links Kloster Eberbach to Kiedrich. The shallow to deep soil of the southwest facing cliffs are composed of Devonian (colored slate) and Pre-Devonian (phyllite and gneiss) rock interspersed with gravelly loess.

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

Refined Riesling Auslese with beguiling fruit notes in the nose; an artful balance between natural sweetness and tart acidity; and a seductive, smoky minerality unique to the slate soil.

VINEYARD NOTES

The vineyard name Thurmberg/Turmberg, or sometimes just 'Berg,' comes from the surviving keep (central tower) of what used to be Scharfenstein Castle. Situated on the estate's south-southwest facing slopes, the single vineyard is composed of predominantlystony, fragmented phyllite with dramatic inclines of up to 60%.

Turmberg lies on the slopes of a steep, slaty crag. Its stony-gritty soils consist primarily of Phyllite mixed with small portions of loess and loam.
