

# WEINGUT ROBERT WEIL

Weingut Robert Weil, founded 1875, is run today by Wilhelm Weil, the fourth generation of the founding family.

The founder of the estate, Dr. Robert Weil, purchased his first vineyards on the Kiedricher Berg in 1867, at a time when he was still a German professor at the Sorbonne in Paris. With the approach of the Franco-Prussian War of 1870/71, he was forced to leave France.

He settled in Wiesbaden, where he worked as a journalist, and Kiedrich, where he expanded his vineyard holdings by acquiring the best sites on the Kiedricher Berg. Thanks to his unwavering commitment to quality-oriented viticulture, his foresight, and his willingness to invest in the estate, it developed quickly and its wines were soon celebrated in international circles. Spätlese and Auslese wines from Weingut Robert Weil graced the table of many European imperial and royal houses as the white counterparts of the Bordeaux reds.

Today, the estate's 90 ha (222 acres) of vineyards are planted 100% with Riesling. Throughout its history the estate has always focused on the Riesling grape and adhered to strict, quality-oriented practices in the vineyard – such as stringent pruning to control yields and selective harvesting by hand – and in the cellar, where the wines are vinified as gently as possible. Consistent quality management guarantees the production of highly-esteemed wines. The estate's dedication to Riesling since 1875 has led numerous observers of the international wine world to regard Weingut Robert Weil, with its "château character", as a worldwide symbol of German Riesling culture.

## **Weingut Robert Weil** **Rheingau Riesling** **Trocken** *VDP.Gutswein*

### **Tasting Notes**

Charming, fruit-driven Riesling whose balanced, tangy flavors means one glass is never quite enough; a merry table companion to a wide range of cuisines, or equally enjoyable when served solo and chilled in a quality glass on its own.

### **Vineyard Notes**

Grapes for our Gutsriesling are harvested from the areas bordering our top classified sites on the Kiedrich Gräfenberg; the medium to deep soil is composed of stony, fragmented phyllite interlaced with loess and loam; and the steep, southwest facing vineyards include inclines of up to 60 %.

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## Kiedricher Riesling Trocken *VDP.Ortswein*

### Tasting Notes

Bright, lively fruit, well integrated, balanced acidity, and a stately Baroque body. Classic stone fruit aromas, and lush citrus flavors are woven into a refined minerality making this the perfect wine to accompany a wide variety of fine cuisine.

### Vineyard Notes

Our "Ortswein" is made using grapes pre-selected from our Erste Lage and Grosse Lage vineyards. The medium to deep soil is composed of phyllite interlaced with loess and loam, with steep inclines measuring up to 60 %.

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## **Kiedrich Klosterberg** **Riesling Trocken** *VDP.Erste Lage*

### **Tasting Notes**

Dry, complex Riesling, with an extreme elegance and minerality shaped by the stony, crumbling soils of the renowned Klosterberg vineyard.

### **Vineyard Notes**

The Klosterberg borders the Kiedrich Turmberg and Kiedrich Gräfenberg - it is the third 'Berg' vineyard of Kiedrich. The name Klosterberg derives from the old path, the so-called 'Klosterweg', that crosses through the vineyards and links Kloster Eberbach to Kiedrich. The shallow to deep soil of the southwest facing cliffs are composed of Devonian (colored slate) and Pre-Devonian (phyllite and gneiss) rock interspersed with gravelly loess.

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## **Kiedrich Turmberg** **Riesling Trocken** *VDP.Erste Lage*

### **Tasting Notes**

The exceptional micro-climate of this south-southwest facing vineyard boasts warm temperatures, long exposure and good wind protection - which in turn leads to a long hang time for the grapes; taken together with the craggy phyllite soils, the result is small, intense and flavorful berries, and dry wines marked by extreme minerality, nuanced complexity, and an unparalleled grace and elegance.

The vineyard name Thurmberg/Turmberg, or sometimes just 'Berg,' comes from the surviving keep (central tower) of what used to be Scharfenstein Castle. Situated on the estate's south-southwest facing slopes, the single vineyard is composed of predominantly stony, fragmented phyllite with dramatic inclines of up to 60 %.

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## **Kiedrich Gräfenberg Riesling Trocken GG** *VDP.Grosse Lage*

### **Tasting Notes**

"Grand Cru from German soil", the finest dry wine the estate has to offer; complex, nuanced structure and minerality; a weighty 'powerhouse' with provocative fruit aromas and a profound depth; a grand, dry Riesling that embodies the exceptional and distinctive qualities of its terroir, and one which will continue to age and develop for decades to come.

Late 12th century saw first mention of this renowned Rheingau vineyard as the 'mons Rhingravii' (the Mountain of the Rhine Counts); southwest-facing site with deep to medium-deep soil, predominantly stony, fragmented phyllite and dramatic inclines of up to 60 %.

Elegant Spätlese with exceptional potential, extreme minerality, and a balanced exchange between natural sweetness and bright acidity; a Riesling possible only from the finest slate-driven vineyards.
